Despite the COVID-19 pandemic,
the number of posted workers from Slovenia
increased by 6% in 2020

Three out of ten workers employed in the Slovenian
construction sector are providing services in another Member State

Six out of ten posted workers from Slovenia are
third country nationals, mainly from Bosnia and Herzegovina

Four out of ten third country nationals employed in Slovenia
are posted to another Member State

The Transnational Provision of Services Act (in force since 1 January 2018)
may have led to a shift from Article 12 towards
Article 13 of Regulation (EC) No 883/2004

Roughly 10% of the requests for a Portable Document A1
issued under Article 12 of Regulation (EC) No 883/2004 is rejected.
The main reason for a rejection are outstanding tax liabilities

Social security contributions for workers posted under Article 12 of Regulation
(EC) No 883/2004 are calculated on the basis of the wage that would
have been paid for comparable work in Slovenia.
This policy creates a competitive advantage
for Slovenian companies
