historical change and transformation can explain current development paths

Relational thinking:

finding social and cultural foundations of economic processes


-ISTORY

actions that have (intended and unintended) consequences on regional development "Although economic geography has a theory of agency and structure, it has nothing in between" Sayer (1982, pp. 80-82)





Idrija: the successful (neo)industrial town












(2010 on)

Kočevje: the reindustrialised town








Trbovlje: post-industrial town

Path creation (2000 on)	 Technological mind-set, creativity Diligence Asset modification / transfer innovators




Bidirectionality: industrial culture human agency

- Complexity of the relationship (enabling, restricting development, or both)







Future research, discussion
